

## **Best Books for Sixth Grade** <sup>[1]</sup>



Topics for this reader group start getting just a little serious while still offering plenty of choices for lighter reading. The mysteries are more pronounced. The family dramas take on social themes and what seem like ordinary events get really unpredictable. But that's what makes all these titles so readable!

### **Strange Case of Origami Yoda** <sup>[2]</sup>by Tom Angleberger

Sixth-grader Tommy and his friends describe their interactions with a paper finger puppet of Yoda, worn by their weird classmate Dwight, as they try to figure out whether or not the puppet can really predict the future. Includes instructions for making Origami Yoda. 141p.

### **Murder at Midnight** <sup>[3]</sup>by Avi

Falsely accused of plotting to overthrow King Claudio, scholarly Mangus the magician, along with his street-smart servant boy, Fabrizio, face deadly consequences unless they can track down the real traitor by the stroke of midnight. 254 p.

### **The Boy Who Dared** <sup>[4]</sup>by Susan C. Bartoletti

In October, 1942, seventeen-year-old Helmuth Hubener, imprisoned for distributing anti-Nazi leaflets, recalls his past life and how he came to dedicate himself to bring the truth about Hitler and the war to the German people. 202p.

### **TF Undertown** <sup>[5]</sup>by Melvin Bukiet

Middle schoolers Timothy Murphy and Jessamyn Hazard careen downhill on a sailboat which was being towed through Manhattan and fall into the sewers, where they meet interesting characters before being caught by the evil "queen" of this underground society. 295 p

### **TF House of Secrets** <sup>[6]</sup>by Chris Columbus

Cordelia, Brendan, and Eleanor Walker, aged fifteen to eight, must rely on a mysterious book to face the Wind Witch and her father, the Storm King, who have kidnapped Dr. and Mrs. Walker and brought them to a strange world of magic. 490 p.

### **TF The Void of Mist and Thunder** <sup>[7]</sup>by James Dashner (13th Reality Bk.#4)

When an all-consuming void from the Fourth Dimension opens up, unleashing monsters throughout the Realities, Mister George has one last weapon at his disposal--the mysterious and powerful Karma button. 483 p.

### **TF Wish You Were Eyre** <sup>[8]</sup>by Heather Vogel Frederick

As the Mother-Daughter Book Club reads *Jane Eyre*, the girls and some of their mothers are involved in some serious competitions, Becca finds romance when the Wyoming pen pals

come for a visit, and a wedding brings the British Berkeley brothers and even Stinkerbelle to Concord. 442 p.

**TF Beholding Bee** <sup>[9]</sup>by Kimberly Newton Fusco

In 1942, when life turns sour at the carnival that has always been her home, eleven-year-old Bee takes her dog, Peabody, and piglet, Cordelia, and sets out to find a real home, aided by two women only Bee and her pets can see. 329 p.

**TF A Tangle of Knots** <sup>[10]</sup>by Lisa Graff

Destiny leads 11-year-old Cady to a peanut butter factory, a family of children searching for their own Talents, and a Talent Thief who will alter her life forever. 230 p.

**Force Out** <sup>[11]</sup>by Tim Green

When Joey has to compete with his best friend, Zach, for a single spot on an elite baseball team, he is forced to decide how far he is willing to go to win. 282p.

**TF Caught** <sup>[12]</sup>by Margaret Peterson Haddix Missing #5 343p.

When Jonah and Katherine travel to early 1900s Switzerland and Serbia to return Albert Einstein's daughter, Lieserl, to history, her mother Mileva grasps entirely too much about time travel and has no intention of letting her daughter go.

**Closed For the Season** <sup>[13]</sup>by Mary Downing Hahn

When thirteen-year-old Logan and his family move into a run-down old house in rural Virginia, he discovers that a woman was murdered there and becomes involved with his neighbor Arthur in a dangerous investigation to try to uncover the killer. 182 p.

**Deep and Dark and Dangerous** <sup>[14]</sup>by Mary Downing Hahn

When thirteen-year-old Ali spends the summer with her aunt and cousin at the family's vacation home, she stumbles upon a secret that her mother and aunt have been hiding for over thirty years. 187 p.

**The Lost Conspiracy** <sup>[15]</sup>by Frances Hardinge

When a lie is exposed and their tribe turns against them, Hathin must find a way to save her sister Arilou--once considered the tribe's oracle--and herself. 566p.

**Take me to the River** <sup>[16]</sup>by Will Hobbs

When North Carolina fourteen-year-old Dylan Sands joins his fifteen-year-old cousin Rio in running the Rio Grande River, they face a tropical storm and a fugitive kidnapper. 184p.

**Enchanted Glass** <sup>[17]</sup>by Diana Wynne Jones

After his grandfather dies, Andrew Hope inherits a house and surrounding land in an English village, but things become very complicated when young orphan Aidan shows up and suddenly a host of variously magical townsfolk and interlopers start intruding on their lives. 292 p.

**TF The Thing About Luck** <sup>[18]</sup>by Cynthia Kadohata

Just when twelve-year-old Summer thinks nothing else can possibly go wrong in a year of bad luck, an emergency takes her parents to Japan, leaving Summer to care for her little brother while helping her grandmother cook and do laundry for harvest workers. 269p.

**White Sands, Red Menace** <sup>[19]</sup>by Ellen Klages

It is 1946, and Dewey Kerrigan is now living near the White Sands Missile Range in New

Mexico with the Gordon family. Dewey and her "sister," Suze, share secrets, art, and science as they adjust to high school in an isolated desert town. Then, Dewey's long-lost mother, Rita Gallucci, reappears in their lives. 337p.

**JF Hideout** <sup>[20]</sup>by Gordon Korman

Luthor's former owner, Swindle, is back trying to reclaim his dog, and it is up to Griffin Bing, Savannah Drysdale and their friends to hide the Doberman until they can come up with a plan to rescue him from the vicious crook. 275 p.

**The Cheat** <sup>[21]</sup>by Amy Goldman Koss

When Sarah gets her hands on the answers to the eighth-grade geography midterm and decides to share them with some other students, the consequences are far-ranging. 176 p.

**Poison Ivy** <sup>[22]</sup>by Amy Goldman Koss

In a government class three popular girls undergo a mock trial for their ruthless bullying of a classmate. 166p.

**TF The Cloak Society** <sup>[23]</sup>by Jeramey Kraatz

Alex Knight, a twelve-year-old in training to be a supervillain in the elite Cloak Society, becomes friends with a young superhero and begins to question where his loyalty lies. 278 p

**TF The Colossus Rises** <sup>[24]</sup>by Peter Lerangis

Teens Jack, Marco, Aly, and Cass begin a quest to find seven pieces of Atlantis's power that were hidden long ago and that will, if returned to Atlantis, save them from certain death due to the genetic abnormality that also gives them superior abilities. 348p

**Black Duck** <sup>[25]</sup>by Janet Taylor Lisle

Years afterwards, Ruben Hart tells the story of how, in 1929 Newport, Rhode Island, his family and his best friend's family were caught up in the violent competition among groups trying to control the local rum-smuggling trade. 252 p.

**Hero** <sup>[26]</sup>by Mike Lupica

Fourteen-year-old Zach learns he has the same special abilities as his father, who was the President's globe-trotting troubleshooter until "the Bads" killed him, and now Zach must decide whether to use his powers in the same way at the risk of his own life. 289 p.

**TF Athlete vs Mathlete** <sup>[27]</sup>by W. C. Mack

When their two worlds collide in seventh grade, fraternal twins and opposites Owen and Russell find themselves in direct competition at school, on the court, and at home. 196p.

**JF The Pirate's Coin: A sixty-Eight Rooms Adventure** <sup>[28]</sup>by Marianne Malone

A magical coin leads sixth-graders Ruthie and Jack to 1753 Massachusetts and to Jack's pirate ancestor when they return to the Art Institute of Chicago's miniature Thorne Rooms on a mission to restore an African American family's reputation. 210p.

**TF Faith Hope and Ivy June** <sup>[29]</sup>by Phyllis Naylor

During a student exchange program, seventh-graders Ivy June and Catherine share their lives, homes, and communities, and find that although their lifestyles are total opposites they have a lot in common. 280 p.

**TF The Mystery: Troubletwisters #3** <sup>[30]</sup> by Garth Nix

When the old man who lives in Rourke Castle dies mysteriously, troubletwister twins Jack and

Jaide Shield find themselves drawn into a search for something hidden in the castle-- something that The Evil wants desperately--but they have no idea what it is they seek. 296p.

**TF Road Trip** <sup>[31]</sup>by Jim & Gary Paulsen

A father and son embark on a road trip to a distant animal shelter to save a homeless border collie puppy

**Hokey Pokey** <sup>[32]</sup>by Jerry Spinelli

Ever since they were Snotsippers, Jack and the girl have fought, until one day she steals his bike and as he and the Amigos try to recover it, Jack realizes that he is growing up and must eventually leave the "goodlands and badlands of Hokey Pokey.?" 285p.

**TF Romeo Blue** <sup>[33]</sup>by Phoebe Stone

During World War II, Felicity Bathburn is living in Bottlebay, Maine, with her eccentric relatives and their foster child Derek, whom she has grown to love, but when a man claiming to be Derek's true father arrives and starts asking all sorts of strange questions Felicity becomes suspicious of his motives. 346p.

**TF Navigating Early** <sup>[34]</sup>by Clare Vanderpool

Odyssey-like adventure of two boys' incredible quest on the Appalachian Trail where they deal with pirates, buried secrets, and extraordinary encounters. 306 p.

**JF Leepike Ridge** <sup>[35]</sup>by Nathan Wilson

While his widowed mother continues to search for him, eleven-year-old Tom, presumed dead after drifting away down a river, finds himself trapped in a series of underground caves with another survivor and a dog, and pursued by murderous treasure-hunters. 224 p.

**TF Ivy in the Shadows** <sup>[36]</sup>by Chris Woodworth

To make ends meet, twelve-year-old Ivy's mother goes to work as a waitress and takes in a boarder, a strange boy named Caleb who Ivy is sure is a liar. 198 p.

Documents the history and significance of mummies, both natural and man-made, and describes the principles and ceremonies associated with them. 72p.

Mission Control, This Is Apollo, recounts space history from the Mercury missions through Apollo 17 and beyond. It is illustrated with stunning full-color paintings by astronaut Alan Bean, who walked on the moon with Pete Conrad on Apollo 12 and has devoted his post-NASA life to creating art. 114p.
